Background:

The gap we are filling is the unjust treatment the Indigenous communities are facing, specifically focusing in the North Vancouver District, the Squamish Nation Peoples. We will be addressing this gap by hosting a festival to honour the Indigenous Culture and showcase the importance of cultural diversity. Although the Squamish Nation community will benefit from this event the general public will be able to grasp a better understanding of their culture values and beliefs.

Relevance to City Goals:

According to the cities strategic plan, the vision and priorities that we are aiming to achieve is called a Vibrant City. - After talking with Alroy Baker (Bucky) we came to the conclusion on how to incorporate our festival into North Vancouver, holding it at Waterfront Park, meeting the specific needs and desires of the Indigenous population. Our plan is to hold this in August, just a month before Truth and Reconciliation Week.

Next steps / Future research:

Next steps would be following through with contacting Indigenous groups and artists that wish to part-take in our event, as well as budgeting.
